
Ceduna Services Reform builds on the good work already happening in Ceduna, bringing service providers together to share knowledge and make the most of skills and resources.

What are we trying to do?


We are working towards an agreed outcome: to reduce the number of alcohol-related deaths and fatalities in and around Ceduna.

We're headed in the right direction!


A significant reduction in number of people apprehended for public intoxication:

What has made the difference?

Liquor restrictions have helped to 'turn the curves' in Ceduna. Over the past few months, Ceduna has also experienced:

- a reduction in alcohol supply
- fewer people at risk of serious harm
- fewer alcohol-related police and security incidents
- fewer and less severe Emergency Department alcohol-related presentations at Ceduna Hospital
- fewer clients leaving the Sobering Up Unit still at risk of harm

This promising start is a foundation to build on in 2016. Summer is an opportune time to test the restrictions during a traditional peak period for alcohol-related incidents. Liquor restrictions running alongside the new Ceduna debit card trial, will help to drive social change.

Ceduna Street Beat – a service innovation

Ceduna Street Beat is one of our headline strategies to reduce alcohol-related harm. Street Beat will start in early 2016. It is an active outreach service with staff from multiple agencies connecting with people, developing relationships to contribute to community safety and wellbeing. The Street Beat will consist of staff from multiple agencies and services protecting the vulnerable, helping the community and ensuring public safety.
