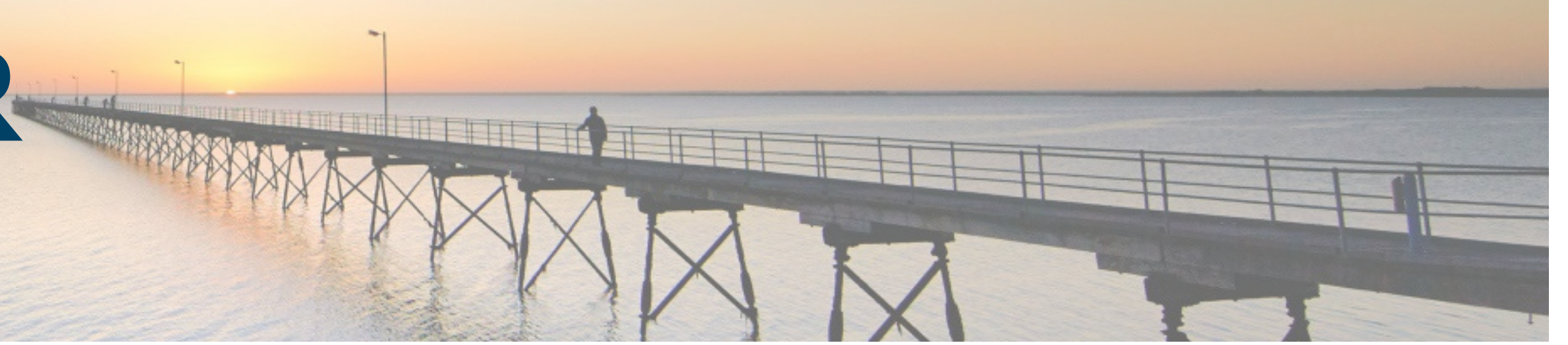

Council Projects

Dog and Cat Fees 2022/2023

Each year Council reviews and sets the fees for dog registration within the parameters set by legislation. Due to recent updates to DACO and changes to the Dog and Cat Management Act there are no longer any individual sub discounts for either microchipping or desexing. For an owner to receive the 50% discount from the category for non-standard to standard dog, the dog must be both desexed and microchipped. An updated copy of the fee structure is available on the Ceduna Council website.

Pinky Point Stairwell

The stairway to the beach adjacent to the Pinky Point barbeque area has been temporarily closed to the public. A number of stair treads and the midway landing point have deteriorated to the extent that they pose an unacceptable risk to the public. Council will endeavour to have the repairs undertaken as soon as possible to return the stairway to a safe standard for public access.

Ceduna Waste Depot

Construction of a new cell at the Ceduna Waste Depot has been completed at a cost of \$380,000. The cell must be constructed to strict environmental standards set by the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA). The EPA standards ensure that the waste does not contaminate the land, groundwater or harm the surrounding environment. The total project cost reflects the mandatory criteria for Ceduna to use the site for waste disposal.



Roads and Open Spaces

Construction on the East and West sections of Nunji Road totaling 10.4kms of unsealed road was completed this month. Patrol grading was carried out on the following roads for the January - February reporting period. Charoba, Borlase, Neilsens, Oats, Back and Kalanbi.

Ceduna Safe Swimming Enclosure

Council have been working with design engineers to identify design concepts that would provide better access to the water for swimmers using the enclosure, and a greater level of amenity for parents and swimmers in place of the existing small floating pontoon. A design has been developed which would provide a fixed platform for the enclosure which can accommodate varying tide levels, in particular shallow water, with the structural stability to tolerate the wave action experienced at the jetty. Council will be making the concept design available to the public for consideration and comments in the near future.
