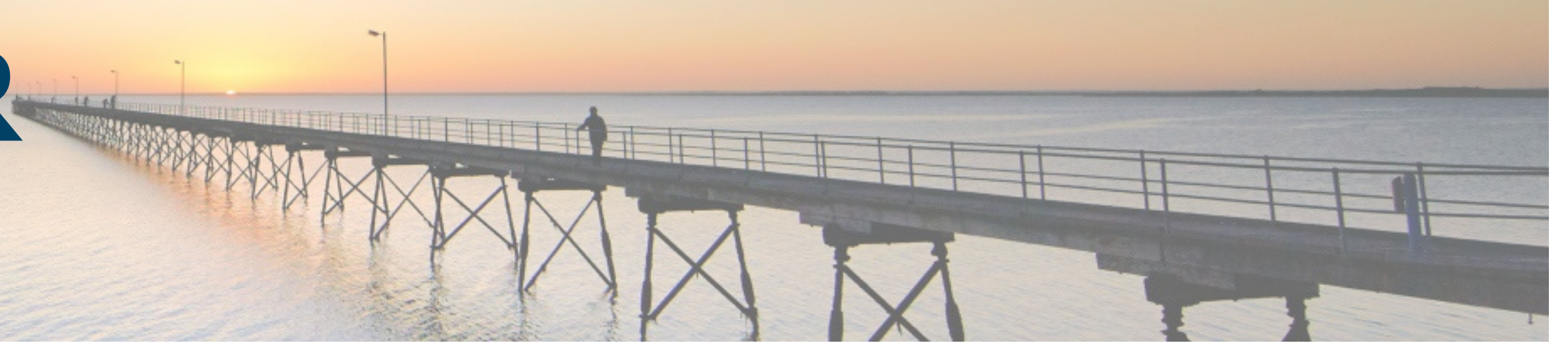

## Council Projects

### Ceduna Swimming Enclosure

An uninvited visitor to the swimming enclosure on Saturday 19 March resulted in the enclosure being closed. A Wobbegong Shark approximately 1.8m in length gave a number of swimmers a fright. The Wobbegong accessed the enclosure via a hole at the base of the net. The Wobbegong Shark is a bottom dweller and is known for resting on the seabed, they are opportunistic feeders and will feed on any prey that come close to them. Although not generally considered to pose a threat to humans, they have attacked divers and swimmers who unknowingly have come too close. Council engaged a commercial diver to ensure the Wobbegong had departed the enclosure and repaired the holes to the net. The swimming enclosure was reopened to the public Monday afternoon.



### Council Meetings Now Online

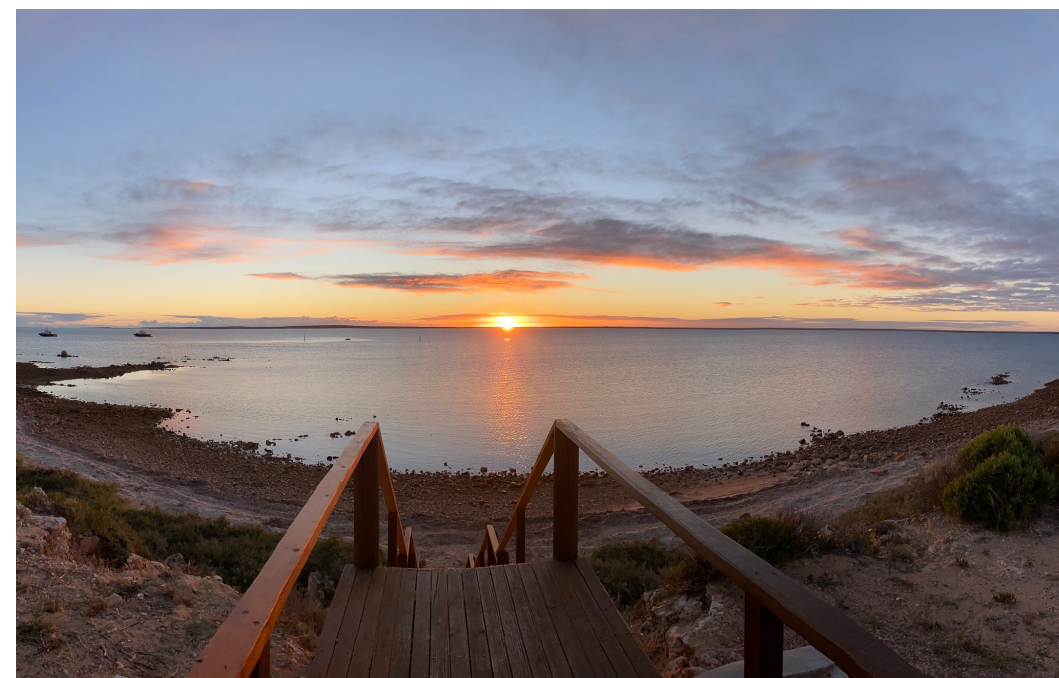

Rural Business Support (RBS) has a new support program fully subsidised for small business owners who are concerned about the impact of drought, bushfire and/or COVID-19 on their business. To be eligible to receive financial counselling, a small business must:

- Have 19 employees or less
- Be experiencing, or at risk of, financial hardship due to drought, bushfire or COVID-19
- Be located in an area classified as rural.
