## Council Projects

### Smoky Bay Revetment Wall

Council recently received \$200,000 funding from the SA Government's Coastal Protection Grants for the construction of a revetment wall on the foreshore of Smoky Bay along the Esplanade from South Terrace to Tremaine Street.

### LRCIP Funding

The Commonwealth Government have provided Council with \$1,058,814 in funding as part of Phase 3 of the Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Programme (LRCIP). All projects will need to be completed by 30 June 2023. The Smoky Bay Revetment Wall and Fixed Platform for the Ceduna Safe Swimming Enclosure are identified as priorities for this funding.

### Oysterfest 2022

Oysterfest 2022 has been successful in their application for a \$15,000 funding boost from the South Australian Tourism Commission Regional Events Grant. The funding will be utilised toward the costs of necessary infrastructure and licensing to host the event.

### Airport

Council was successful in their application for funding from the SA Government's Support Regional Aviation Program, to assist with the installation of an animal exclusion fence around the perimeter of the Ceduna Airport.

Council received \$70,000 toward this project. Tenders for the project, are available can be found on SA Tenders or Council website.

### Public Amenities Improvement

Works will commence within the next month to replace 5 existing public toilet blocks and construct 3 new public toilets within the Council district. This would not have occurred without the generous funding received from both the State and Federal Governments that totalled \$960,000.

**NAIDOC:** An opportunity is available to both Indigenous and non Indigenous organisations to contribute to the costs of local and regional NAIDOC activities across Australia.
